The City Governing Body met in regular session with Mayor Weethee presiding, Commissioners Mitchell and Johnson present.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

Appropriation Ordinance #468

An Ordinance making an appropriation in the amount of \$33,776.07 was introduced and placed upon its first reading. Read the first time and upon motion the rules were suspended and the ordinance put upon its second and final reading. Read the second time, considered by sections and put upon its final passage. The question being, shall the ordinance pass. A vote was taken resulting in Ayes, three, Nays, none. The vote being unanimous for, the ordinance was declared duly passed.

Final estimate filed
Paving South Hickory Street
7th to 9th and 12th to 13th.

C. A. Novak, engineer in charge filed his final estimate of the cost of paving South Hickory street from Seventh to Ninth streets and Twelfth to Thirteenth streets. He reports the work as satisfactorily completed and recommends its acceptance.

On his recommendation, this work is accepted by the governing body.

Surety Bonds Filed- Pool Halls

L. A. Bowers, Richardson and Cummings, and Lee Keller filed surety bonds covering the operation of Pool halls in accordance with Ordinance No. 1350.

These bonds meeting the requirements of this ordinance are hereby approved and are to be filed in the office of the city clerk.

Member of Auditorium Board Appointed

John G. Kaiser was appointed to fill out the unexpired term on the Auditorium Board, of G. F. Kaiser, deceased.

Scavenger Contract Approved.

The contract, duly authorized by the governing body for scavenger service, is hereby approved conditional on the filing of a bond by Albert A. Peterson covering his work as said scavenger.

Agreement- In re taking down and putting up Special Christmas street wiring.

On request of Glen H. Hill and A. P. Elder, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce it was agreed that the Water and Light Department would oversee the taking down and putting up of the special Holiday wiring and fixtures, but that they would in no wise be responsible for the wear and tear and depreciation of said fixtures and wiring. The cost amounting to \$67.58, for taking down the wires and fixtures was paid by the Water and Light Department. Reports filed.

Monthly reports of city clerk, city treasurer, water and light department, sexton of Highland for November and December, sexton of Hope Cemetery, Police department, dairy inspector, and semi monthly report of city market were inspected, approved and filed with the city clerk.

Ordinance No. 1449- Final Reading.

An Ordinance prohibiting the purchase of personal property by junk shop or second hand store dealers or pawn brokers from minors and prohibiting the sale of personal property to said persons by minors and providing a penalty therefor was put upon its second reading. Read the second time, considered by sections and put upon its final reading. The question being, shall the ordinance pass. A vote was taken resulting in Ayes, three, Nays, none. The vote being unanimous for, the ordinance was declared duly passed.

Library Appointments.

C. M. Thomas and Geo. B. Ross were appointed by the mayor and approved by the Governing Body, to succeed themselves on the Library Board. Their terms commencing January 1st, 1928.



Claim Filed- by Annie England.



A petition, signed by residents and property owners in the vicinity of Seventh and Cherry streets, was filed, requesting the City Governing body to amend the present Zoning Ordinance to permit the creating of a Neighborhood Business district on the south half of Lot number 34 and all of Lot number 36 in Block 130 of the Original Townsite. This location is on the north side of Seventh street and west of Cherry street.

It was decided to recommend this amendment to the Original Zoning Ordinance and the city attorney was instructed to draw up an amending ordinance, which is to be submitted to the Zoning Commission with the Governing Body's recommendation.

An Ordinance amending Ordinance number 1428 of the city of Ottawa, Kansas, which provides for the improvement of the alley in Block 98 of said city by grading and paving same, and providing for the payment of the costs thereof, and repealing Section 2 of said ordinance, was put upon its first reading. Read the first time and under the rules was laid over until its second and final reading.

Request of Municipal Power Transmission Company for permission to take on additional Electric load in excess of 50 K. W.

Request for permission to increase their present lower load, the increase to exceed 50 K. W. to the Lewis Crusher Company of Garnett, was asked of the city by the Municipal Power Transmission Company.




Permit from state for Lateral Sewer 94.

Adjustment of Paving and sewer tax assessments.


The city clerk was instructed to calculate and refund interest, on the final year of assessment, on paving and sewer bond tax assessments where on account of the relative date of the bond to the tax assessment year, it became necessary to compute in the taxes of the first year, for a year and six months interest.

The refund to be made is for 45 per cent of the interest on the total assessment for the period of one year on paving bonds running 10 years and 40 per cent of the interest on the total assessment on sewer bonds running five years for the period of one year. This refund is the difference in computing the interest on the unpaid assessments for one and one half years the first year and for six months the final year of the tax assessment.



Demand of Attorney General-for removal of

Appointment of dog catcher

Frank Baggs was appointed dog catcher and manager of the city dump with a salary of \$30.00 a month commencing March 1st. He is also to receive \$1.00 per head for dogs caught and disposed of and 50% per cent.

Petition for street lights

Whereas, upon such hearing it is found that such petition is in conformity to the requirements of law and that the allegations thereof are true and that it is advisable to so illuminate said portion of said street and that the costs thereof will not be burdensome upon the persons to be directly benefited, and decision to that effect is made, now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the governing body of said city that they declare the construction, installment, equipment and maintenance of such additional system of lights as may be required for that purpose, necessary to be done, and that said governing body should cause such additional system of lighting to be constructed, installed, equipped and maintained and to contract therefore, and the petitioners having failed to specify the kind and number of lights to be installed and operated, the lights shall be of the following kind and at the following intervals:

Each of said lights shall be of 400 candle power, set on single light posts and spaced at intervals of approximately 75 feet on each side of the street.

Whereas, the city of Ottawa, Kansas passed a resolution to improve ~~that~~ West Seventh street road extending West 1290 feet from the west line of Beech street in said city. In words and figures as follows:

"Whereas, the city of Ottawa in Franklin County, Kansas is a city of the secondclass having a population of less than 65,000 inhabitants, and west Seventh street is wholly within the city of Ottawa from Main street to the west line of Beech street, and the north half of West seventh street from the west line of Beech street west, a

distance of 150 feet is within the corporate limits of the city of Ottawa, the south half of said Seventh street from Beech street west being within the country and outside of the city of Ottawa and

Whereas, the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa believes that it is now expedient, and a public necessity exists to improve said West seventh street from the existing pavement on said West Seventh street westward as far as the west corporate limits of said city and thence westward on the country highway without the corporate limits of said city for a distance of 1140 feet upon the road or highway connecting with such street, to the west line of Section 2, twp. 16-S Range 19-E.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing body of the city of Ottawa, Kansas, that said West Seventh street from the existing paving thereon at the west line of the intersection of Beech street and west Seventh street be improved westward to the west corporate limits of said city and thence, on the country road or highway westward a distance of 1140 feet from the west corporate limits of the city to the west line of Section 2, twp, 16-S Range 19- E.

That said West Seventh street be brought to a proper grade and paved with concrete or with brick and asphalt filler laid upon a foundation of crushed rock: that the width of said pavement shall be 18 feet; that a Benefit district within said city to bear the cost of such part of said improvement as shall be charged upon specific property within said city, is described and within the following boundaries, to-wit:

Commencing at the intersection of the north line of West Seventh street with the west line of Beech street, thence north along the west line of Beech street 100 feet, thence west 150 feet to the west corporate line of the city 100 feet to the north line of West seventh street, thence east 150 feet to place of beginning.

That the several tracts and parcels of ground within such benefit district are more particularly described as follows:

C. F. Wolf: The east 150 feet of the following described tract: Commencing 967½ feet east and 30 feet north of the Southwest corner of the Southwest quarter of Sec. 35, Twp 16, range 19, thence running north 100 feet, thence east 322½ feet thence south 100 feet thence west 322½ feet, being the south 100 feet of what has been heretofore known as lot 10 of Baldwin and Taylor's addition to Ottawa, Kansas.


