Appropriation Ordinance No. 585:

An ordinance making an appropriation in the amount of \$27055.71 was introduced and put upon its first reading. Read the first time and upon Motion the rules were suspended and it was put upon its second and final reading. Read the second time, considered by sections and put upon its final passage. The question being, shall the ordinance pass. A vote was taken resulting in Ayes three, Nays None. The vote being unanimous for, the ordinance was declared duly passed.

Ordinance No. 1550: Second Reading.
City Forestry..

An ordinance pertaining to planting, removing, trimming, protecting and otherwise caring for trees upon all public streets, alleys, parks and public grounds in the City of Ottawa, Kansas and fixing penalties for the violation thereof and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, and creating the office of City Forestry of said city prescribing his duties and tenure of office and providing for levying and collecting of a tax creating a City Forestry Fund was introduced and put upon its second and final reading. Read the second time, considered by sections and put upon its final passage. The question being, shall the ordinance pass. A vote was taken resulting in Ayes three, Nays none. The vote being unanimous for, the ordinance was declared duly passed.

Ordinance First Reading: Vacating portion of
N. Main street.

An ordinance vacating that portion of N. Main street in the city of Ottawa, Kansas between the intersection of the north line of Dundee street and Main street in the City of Ottawa, Kansas and the north corporate limits of said city, was introduced and put upon its first reading. Read the first time and under the rules laid over until its second and final reading.

Resolution Electric Refund 1931:

Resolution of the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, ordering payment of a rebate to certain consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of said city during the year 1931.

WHEREAS, No reduction in electric rates has been made by the City Water & Light Department of Ottawa, Kansas, to consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, subsequent to January 1, 1930 and the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas being of the opinion that a rebate of ten (10%) per cent of the total amount paid by all consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of the City of Ottawa, Kansas for electric service for the year 1931, should be made to all such consumers who are now users of electricity within said city and whose electric services have remained unchanged since January 1, 1931 and in each instance where a change has been made in said electric service since January 1, 1931, and to new consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of said city who are now users of electricity, applying for such service since January 1, 1931, that a rebate of ten (10%) per cent of the total amount paid by such consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of the City of Ottawa, Kansas to the Water & Light Department of said city for electric service during that portion of the year 1931 since the last change in said electric service prior to December 31, 1931, and since the date of installation of said new service prior to December 31, 1931, therefore,

Be it Resolved by the Governing Body of The City of Ottawa, Kansas.

That the Water & Light Department of the City of Ottawa, Kansas out of the funds on hand in said department, pay to all consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of the City of Ottawa, Kansas who are now consumers of electricity and whose electric services have remained unchanged since January 1, 1931 an amount equal to ten (10%) per cent of the total amount paid by such consumers to the Water & Light Department of the City of Ottawa, Kansas for electric service rendered during the year 1931, and in each instance where a change has been made in said electric service since January 1, 1931 and to all new consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of said city who are now users of electricity, applying for such service since January 1, 1931, that the Water & Light Department of said City, out of the funds on hand in said department, pay to such consumers of electricity used within the City of Ottawa, Kansas, a rebate of ten (10%) per cent of the total amount paid to the Water & Light Department of said City by such consumers of electricity used within the corporate limits of said city and who are now consumers of electricity, for electric service rendered during that portion of the year 1931 since the last change in said electric service prior to December 31, 1931, and since the date of installation of said new electric service prior to December 31, 1931.

The foregoing Resolution was duly passed by the City Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Franklin County, Kansas January 6th, 1932.

Purchase of Property from Wm A.Swift and wife



Read the second time, considered by sections and put upon its final passage. The question being, shall the ordinance pass. A vote was taken resulting in Ayes Three, Nays None. The vote being unanimous for, the Ordinance was declared duly passed.

Water Hydrants ordered installed:

By unanimous vote of the City Governing Body, the Water & Light Department was ordered to install water hydrants at the corners of Willow and Fourth Sts and Elm and Fourth Streets.

Notice to Burroughs Adding Machine Co.:

The City Governing Body authorized W. O. Myers, Supt. of the Water & Light Dept., to formerly notify the Burroughs Adding Machine Co. of the unsatisfactory operation of the Billing Machine installed in their office and to take the necessary steps looking to satisfactory adjustment of this condition.

Petition to Amend Zoning Ordinance:

A Petition signed by eleven property owners in Block 113 Original Townsite in the City of Ottawa was filed with the City Clerk petitioning the City Governing Body to amend the zoning ordinance so as to take out of the Residential District and place in the Multiple Dwelling District lots 2-4-6 of the above mentioned Block.

Ordinance;- First Reading;- Lateral Sewer District
Number 100

An ordinance creating Lateral Sewer District NO.100 in the City of Ottawa, Kansas, authorizing the construction of lateral sewers therein, and providing for the payment of the cost thereof was introduced and put upon its first reading. Read the first time and under the rules laid over until its second and final reading.

Resolution: Change Three-part-rate Plan of Gas Charge.

Whereas, a petition has been filed with the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, protesting against the three part rate charged natural gas consumers in this city by the Union Public Service Gas Company.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas that the City of Ottawa enter formal protest with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of Kansas against such three part rate and asking for its abolishment and that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare the necessary papers for presenting this matter to the Public Utilities Commission and that be make such investigation as is needed to properly present this matter.




Authorizing C.A.Novak to do usual cleanup of Forest Park Swimming Pool & Buildings.
