Appropriation Ordinance No 6 1 3

An Ordinance making an appropriation in the sum of \$ 15,944.75 was introduced and put upon its first reading. Read the first time and under the rules was put upon its second and final reading. Read the 2nd time, considered by sections, and put upon its final passage. The question being, shall the ordinance pass. A vote was taken resulting in Ayes Three, Nays None. The vote being unanimous for, the ordinance was declared duly passed.

Resolution: In re: Sump & Pipe-Line Right-of-way Bennett Creamery Co.

A Resolution granting permission to the Bennett Creamery Company to construct, operate and maintain unloading sump and pipe line for unloading fuel oil in Walnut Street immediately west of Bennett Creamery plant in Block 32, City of Ottawa, Kansas.

WHEREAS, The Bennett Creamery Co. a corporation, of Ottawa, Kansas, has requested permission from the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, to construct, operate and maintain an unloading sump and pipe line for unloading fuel oil in Walnut St. in said city immediately west of the plant of the Bennett Creamery Company in Block 32 of said City and has further informed the Governing Body of said city that the installation and maintenance of such improvement has the express consent and approval of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Co.

THEREFORE, Be it Resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, that permission is hereby granted unto the Bennett Creamery Co. a corporation, to construct, operate and maintain an unloading sump and pipe line for unloading fuel in Walnut Street in said City immediately west of the plant of the Bennett Creamery Company in Block 32 of said city, such improvement and the maintenance thereof to be agreeable to the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Co., and provided further that the said Bennett Creamery Company, a corporation, in availing itself of the terms and provisions herein granted agrees to indemnify and save harmless the said City of Ottawa, Kansas, from all damages of every kind and nature whatsoever growing out of, or arising from the construction, operation and maintenance of said unloading and pipe line.

The foregoing Resolution was duly adopted by the Governing Body.






In Re: Answer from State Highway Commission in regard to Petition from the Governing Body of Ottawa for Federal Aid (Main st.Imp.)
