SE Main Sewer Extension No. 2

Petition: New Sidewalk - King Street, Wilson to Blackhawk

A petition signed by more than ten citizens owning real estate in the Fourth Ward of the City of Ottawa, Kansas was duly filed in the office of the City Clerk praying for the construction of sidewalks on the west side of King Street in said city from Wilson to Blackhawk Streets.

The petition in question was found to be sufficient by the City Governing Body and the City Attorney was instructed to prepare the necessary resolution providing for such improvement.

Resolution: Improve Princeton Street, 7th to 8th Streets

Whereas, 7th Street and 8th Street in the City of Ottawa, Kansas are parallel to each other, one block apart, and adjoin and intersect Princeton Street in said city, and whereas said 7th Street and 8th Street have been graded, guttered, curbed and paved, and whereas Princeton Street in said city is an intersecting connection street between 7th Street and 8th Street, and has not been graded, guttered, curbed, paved, or macadamized from the south line of 7th Street to the north line of 8th St.,

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the same being a distance of one Block, the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas deems it necessary to grade, gutter, curb, and pave Princeton Street in said city from the south line of 7th Street to the north line of 8th Street;

Therefore, be it resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, that it is necessary to grade, gutter, curb, and pave Princeton Street in said city from the south line of 7th Street to the north line of 8th Street, and that such pavement be constructed of steel reinforced Portland cement concrete of an average thickness of six inches, and of an overall width of twenty-five (25) feet which shall include raised edges to serve in place of separately constructed curbs, and that the Governing Body of said city does hereby declare such work and improvement necessary to be done, and that special assessments shall be levied to pay for the same.

This resolution is passed under authority of Section 12-603, General Statutes of Kansas 1935, providing for improvement of intervening street connections.

The foregoing resolution was this day duly passed and adopted by a unanimous vote of the City Governing Body.

Resolution: Improve Princeton Street, 8th to 9th Streets


Whereas 8th Street and 9th Street in the City of Ottawa, Kansas are parallel to each other, one Block apart, and adjoin and intersect Princeton Street in said city, and whereas said 8th and 9th Streets have been graded, guttered, curbed, and paved, and whereas Princeton Street in said city is an intersecting street between 8th Street and 9th Street, and has not been graded, guttered, curbed, paved or macadamized from the south line of 8th Street to the north line of 9th Street, the same being a distance of one Block, the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas deems it necessary to grade, gutter, curb, and pave Princeton Street from the south line of Eighth Street to the north line of Ninth Street;

Therefore, be it resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, that it is necessary to grade, gutter, curb, and pave Princeton Street in said city from the south line of 8th Street to the north line of 9th Street, and that such pavement be constructed of steel reinforced Portland cement concrete of an average thickness of six inches, and an overall width of twenty-five (25) feet which shall include raised edges to serve in place of separately constructed curbs, and that the Governing Body of said city does hereby declare such work and improvement necessary to be done, and that special assessments shall be levied to pay for the same.
