"I, Robert W. Luce, Mayor of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, by virtue of the authority in me vested by law, and in accordance with the request of a valid petition heretofore duly filed with the City Clerk of said city, hereby give public notice and duly proclaim that a Special Election will be had and held in said city on Tuesday, March 17, 1953, at which said special election the following question will be submitted to the qualified electors of said city for adoption, to-wit:

"Shall the City of Ottawa, Kansas, adopt the provisions of Chapter 86, Laws of Kansas, 1917, and amendments thereto, providing for City-Manager Plan of Government?"

The polls of said special election will be open from and between the hours of eight o'clock A. M., and six o'clock P. M.,

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on said 17th day of March, 1953, and said Special Election shall be conducted by the officers or persons designated according to law for the holding thereof.

Be It Resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas: that an emergency with respect to the water situation is hereby declared to exist and that the following rules with respect to the use of water be and they are hereby declared to exist and be in full force and effect:

Rule 1 - No person, firm, corporation or other entity using water from and through the facilities of the municipal water works of said city shall use water for any of the purposes as follows:


- (a) Lawn sprinkling
- (b) Car washing
- (c) In airconditioning systems, unless a cooling tower and water conservation return system is employed
- (d) All other unnecessary purposes
