





Engineer's Report: Rebuild, Enlarge and Improve  
Sewage Disposal Works

Pursuant to contract dated April 10, 1946, as amended September 15, 1948, Black & Veatch, Consulting Engineers, this day filed their report and recommendations relating to the rebuilding, enlarging, improving and the making of extensive repairs to the Sewage Disposal Works of the city.

Such report set forth that the Sewage Disposal Works is badly in need of the extensive repairs, enlargement and improvements as set forth in the report at the estimated cost of \$ 166,738.00, and that such improvements be undertaken without delay.

The report of the engineers was concurred in by Dwight L. Metzler, representative, Kansas State Board of Health, Division of Water & Sewage, who was in attendance at this meeting. Mr. Metzler stated it was his opinion the Kansas State Board of Health would be in the position soon of having to issue a formal order to the city for abatement of existing stream pollution unless the improvements contemplated in the Engineers Report were undertaken forthwith.

The City Governing Body, upon giving the Report of the Engineers and the recommendations of the Kansas State Board of Health due consideration, this day made the decision to submit the Question of issuance of \$ 165,000.00 in general obligation bonds to the qualified electors of said city at the General Municipal Election to be held April 4, 1950, providing for the improvements of the Sewage Disposal Works in accordance with the recommendations of Black & Veatch, Consulting Engineers, and the Kansas State Board of Health.



Strike? - Certain Employees of the City in the  
Water & Light Department

Without notice, and so far as any information available to the City Governing Body is concerned, without cause, all linemen, meter readers and ordermen of the Water and Light Department of the city failed to report for work the morning of August 1, 1950.

Upon consulting with R. R. Redmond, City Attorney, in relation to the action of such city employees, the following Notice was duly executed by all members of the City Governing Body and served upon each such employees by the Police Chief on August 1, 1950, to-wit:

"Please be advised that your services with the City of Ottawa, Kansas will be terminated as of 8 o'clock A. M., Wednesday, August 2, 1950, unless you report for work at that time, or present to the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, a good and sufficient reason for your absence from work."

On August 2, 1950 the city employees aforesaid failed to report for work, neither was any reason given what-so-ever for their absence from work. A "Picket Line" was established at the power plant resulting in the Maintenance Crew at the Power Plant not reporting for work too.



Such report stated that the hearing was held according to law; that a protest was filed, in writing, against such proposed change; and that it was the unanimous decision of the City Planning Commission that the proposed change be not made and that the application filed for such purpose be denied.

Upon giving the report and recommendations of the City Planning Commission due consideration, the City Governing Body, by a unanimous vote, duly approved and concurred in such report, and ordered the file closed on such matter.

**Strike? Continued: Water & Light Department Employees**

In further regard to the work stoppage in the Water & Light Department, it is recorded here that during the preceding week information reached the City Governing Body, through the press and otherwise, that the linemen, meter readers and ordermen were out on Strike until such time as the city would manifest a willingness to recognize the Business Manager of the IBEW Union, affiliate of the AFofL, as the Business Agent representing such employees in matters relating to their employment with the city. This was confirmed at an informal meeting held with such employees in the City Hall, August 7, 1950, at which time the City Governing Body informed such employees as follows:

1. That the City Commissioners had no intention or desire to negotiate with anyone, other than such employees themselves, relating to conditions of their employment with the city. (Such position being supported by the opinion of the City Attorney now on file in the office of the City Clerk.)

2. That the City Commissioners were firm in the opinion that management of our municipally owned utility would not be improved upon by delegating, unlawfully, to others the matter of labor management of the utility.

3. That the City Commissioners were further of the opinion that competence, loyalty and satisfactory performance of duties should be the measure of an employee's continued employment by the city under conditions mutually agreed upon; that each such employee should be free to decide for himself whether or not to join a labor organization; and that it is the duty of the City Commissioners to see to it that an employee is not subject to annoyance and disruption of work by others if he decides to remain free of union labor affiliations.

The "Picket Line" heretofore established at the Power Plant was withdrawn on August 8, 1950 permitting the Maintenance Crew at the Power Plant to resume work August 9, 1950, and the City Governing Body this day proceeded forthwith in the matter of employing necessary personnel to fill the vacancies caused by the "Strike or Walkout" on August 1, 1950.
