Agreement: AT&SF R.R. - Electric Pole Easement



Use Forest Park- American Legion


The City Governing Body approved request of American Legion Post to use Forest Park for Carnival purposes during the month of May for a period of one week.

Plat Filed: Robert Coleman - Area 10th & Olive



Recommendation: Planning Commission - Re-Zone Area 13th to 15th W. Main





Annexation of Area- Old Hi-Way 59




Recommendations: Benches in Downtown Area




Protest: Re-Zone Area - West Side Main -13th to 15th


Improvement to Memorial Auditorium- Lion's Club
