
The Governing Body accepted bid of Robertson Motor Co. for 2 Police Cars and Moore Chevrolet-Olds for pick-up.

Recommendation : Ottawa Industrial Development, Inc.



Complaint: Operation of City Landfill



Contract Let- Remove and Place in Storage - Park Entrance



Status of G.E. Contract- STAG Unit





Petition : Liquor, Package on Ballot


