Capper, to appear at hearing in K.C., Mo., Jan. 10, 1966 and file the objection and resolution.

Resolution : Hearing - Improve Ash & Eleventh Streets



The Franklin County Real Estate Board submitted letter asking that the Street Markers in City be renovated and placed in first class condition. The Governing Body directed that this work be accomplished.


Directive: Governing Body - Remove Overhead Utilities - Alley 200 S. Main
